



Hereditary Cancer: Family History Questionnaire

WHAT IS HEREDITARY CANCER?

Most families do not have hereditary cancer. Sometimes a change (mutation) in a gene that increases the risk of cancer can be passed down from one generation to the next. Not every person who has the gene mutation will get cancer. In families with hereditary cancer, several relatives may have had cancer at a younger age.

Use this template to make note of cancer cases in your family. Fill in the boxes to the best of your knowledge.

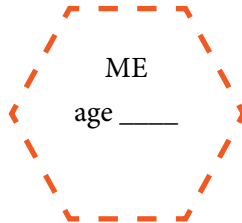
For your relatives with known cancer, identify:
